






## Main Venue: Makuhari Messe

Proposed Meeting Spaces: International Conference Hall(2F – 3F)





## City and venue

Chiba City is the capital of Chiba Prefecture, located approximately halfway between Narita International Airport and Tokyo. It is a large, developing city that plays a large role in capital functions. On the other hand, the city that is also rich in lush greenery and beautiful waterfronts. The suggested venue, Makuhari Messe is the city's main convention complexes located in Makuhari area.
